- “Attractive, helpful surroundings”





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Too much information and too little time to digest it. Attention pulled in a thousand directions, and by the very technologies – cell phones and handhelds, email and the Web, cable TV and satellite radio – that promise to inform and connect us. 




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Q4 2006 - Posts by Language
