Nihon Rekishi Chimei Taikei - Database Trial



We are conducting a trial of the *Nihon rekishi chimei taikei* (日本歷史地名大系) database (an added component to the <u>JapanKnowledge</u> subscription database). This Japanese place name database includes over 200 000 entries and allows for both title keyword and full-text searching.
